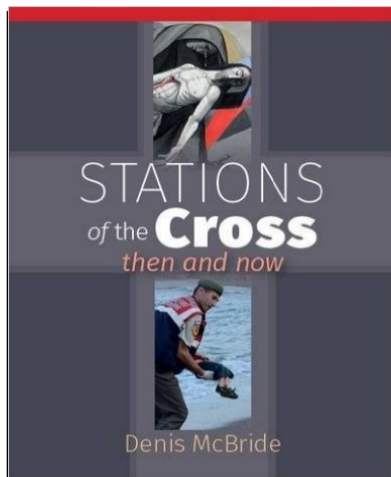


Lenten Programme @ St. James the Great, Petts Wood

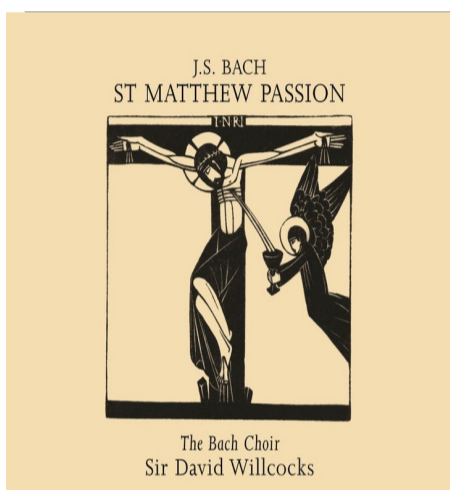
